## Narrative Responses

### GENERAL

#### Executive Summary 91.220(b)

The Town of Christiansburg, VA has identified the following objectives and outcomes for the CDBG program.

#### Town of Christiansburg Objectives:

This Annual Action Plan outlines the activities which will be undertaken during the program year beginning October 1, 2010 and ending September 30, 2011 using Federal funds granted to the Town of Christiansburg by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). Programs and activities described in this plan are intended to primarily benefit low-income and moderate income residents of the Town of Christiansburg, neighborhoods with high concentrations of low-income and moderate-income residents, and the town as a whole.

This plan is the product of citizen and street committee input, which is consistent with the Town of Christiansburg's 2010-2014 Five-Year Consolidated Plan. This public participation has included a public hearing, and consultation with other groups and organizations involved in the development of affordable housing and affordable housing quality of life.

#### VISION

1. Develop and upgrade portions of the public infrastructure to enhance the quality of life for citizens in the Low to Moderate Income Block Groups. To facilitate the development, funds will be used from the Department of Housing and Urban Development's Community Development Block Grant Program. The goals and objectives of the Consolidated Action Plan serve as a representation of the Citizen's, Town Councils, and Street Committee's vision for the development of the of the community and its future.
2. Fund activities that will promote the development of Low and Moderate Income areas within the Town of Christiansburg.

#### Summary of Proposed Outcomes:

- The proposed outcomes by participating in the CDBG program will be a greater sense of community and connectivity of neighborhoods. Various residential areas lie adjacent to community commercial uses, and by providing the necessary links between the two uses, an improved transportation network will be achieved.

- **Other:** The Town of Christiansburg is proposing one administrative grant/project to fund the costs associated with administrating the town's CDBG program.

**Unmet Objectives and Outcomes:** During the five years in which the Consolidated Plan is active, the Town of Christiansburg works with and encourages applicants to select projects that meet the needs and goals identified in the current Consolidated Plan. Those goals are later categorized as eligible objectives and outcomes.

#### Summary of Accomplishments:

The Town of Christiansburg's goals include utilizing available resources to improve and maintain existing infrastructure and housing opportunities. The Town of Christiansburg has not participated in previous years funding due to geographic limitations. Areas of concern have been identified by the street committee, thus allowing for the funds to be used in the Low to Moderate Income areas.

### Citizen Participation 91.220(b)

Provide a summary of the citizen participation process.

To ensure the public was fully informed of the process and given every opportunity to provide comment and input, the Town of Christiansburg provided copies of the draft plan at Town Hall and on the Town's Website. The Town of Christiansburg advertised the 30-day public review process in local papers and on the Town's website. Draft copies of the Consolidated Action Plan will be made available to interested parties at the Christiansburg Library, Town offices, and on the Town's website. The public review ended on July 31, 2010. A public hearing was held on August 3, 2010 in order to solicit input.

2. Provide a summary of the citizen participation and consultation process (including efforts to broaden public participation in the development of the plan).

**Public Comments:** A copy of the legal notice for the Town of Christiansburg Public Hearing, 30-day Public Comment Period, and comments received are included in **Attachment A**.

3. Provide a summary of citizen comments or views on the plan.

**Participation Outreach:** The Town of Christiansburg supports and encourages the participation of citizens, community groups, and other interested agencies in both the development and the evaluation of the Plan's programs and activities. The citizen participation process is designed to encourage input from all residents including non-English speaking and minority populations. Extremely low and low income persons are especially encouraged to participate in the process. Attempts are made to include residents of areas where projects currently exist or are proposed.

4. Provide a written explanation of comments not accepted and the reasons why these comments were not accepted.

All reasonable public comments received during the 30-day Public Comment Period and at public hearings related to the plan will be accepted. However, due to funding constraints, it is anticipated that not all requests for funding can be honored. Please See **Attachment B** for a full list of comments and responses.

CDBG funds will be used to address the needs and objectives identified in the plan. The Town of Christiansburg general fund will ensure proper maintenance of all facilities. The Town has been allocated to receive \$113,195 for the 2010 year. No other funds will be used to meet program needs.

6. Identify federal resources the jurisdiction expects to receive from the Housing and Economic Recovery Act and the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act that will be used to address priority needs and specific objectives identified in the plan.

The Town of Christiansburg expects to receive zero dollars from the Housing and Economic Recovery Act and the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act.

The proposed projects are detailed in the project sheets (Table 3C) included in **Attachment D**. The project sheets detail the priority need and objective to be addressed. In addition, each description provides information on the number and type of household that will benefit from the activity, the proposed accomplishments, geographic location, funding sources, and amount of funding. Also included is a drawing showing the project location and existing site condition photographs.

As required under the March 7, 2006 Notice of Outcome Performance Measurement System for Community Development and Development Formula Grant programs, grantees are required to incorporate performance measurements into annual action plans starting FY2006. Each Town of Christiansburg objective corresponds to both a HUD Outcome Category: Availability / Accessibility, Affordability, Sustainability (promoting livable or viable communities), and one of the HUD Objectives: Decent Housing, Suitable Living Environment and Creating Economic Opportunity.

The location of the Park Street Neighborhood will benefit the low-income persons adjoining the site, as well as the entire Town population. The Park Street Neighborhood is in the geographic center of Town and is adjacent to the Downtown Commercial Core. Infrastructure improvements, primarily the installation of sidewalks, will receive priority attention. 100% of project funds will be directed to this area.

12. Describe the reasons for the allocation priorities, the rationale for allocating investments geographically within the jurisdiction (or within the EMSA for HOPWA) during the next year, and identify any obstacles to addressing underserved needs.

The priorities were established based on the needs of the eligible jurisdictional area and available funds. The Park St. Neighborhood, which is bordered by East Main St., Depot St. and Roanoke St. will receive priority attention during this funding cycle.

The CDBG funds received for the period covered by this action plan will not be used to specifically address public housing needs. The existing residents in the Low to Moderate Income Area will directly benefit from the upgraded and newly constructed sidewalks.

The CDBG funds received for the period covered by this action plan will not be used to specifically address affordable housing needs, but will indirectly assist in removing barriers. The proposed sidewalk infrastructure will help eliminate possible perceptions of inadequate public infrastructure. The Town Code will be reviewed and possibly edited during this funding cycle in order to protect and strengthen residential districts.

## Other Actions 91.220(k)

20. Describe the actions that will take place during the next year to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs, foster and maintain affordable housing, evaluate and reduce the number of housing units containing lead-based paint hazards, reduce the number of poverty-level families develop institutional structure, enhance coordination between public and private agencies (see 91.215(a), (b), (i), (j), (k), and (l)).

The Town of Christiansburg will address obstacles to meeting underserved needs by targeting funds to projects addressing their needs.

**Sustainable Living Environment:** CDBG funds will be used by programs that offer new or upgraded public infrastructure (sidewalks) to area residents needing help getting to and from necessary services.

## Monitoring

1. Describe actions that will take place during the next year to monitor its housing and community development projects and ensure long-term compliance with program requirements and comprehensive planning requirements.

The Town of Christiansburg staff and chosen consultant will assure program compliance in the CDBG program by conducting a risk analyses and monitoring projects.

The CDBG program monitors high-risk projects as a first priority. The areas reviewed to determine the risk level includes meeting goals, management procedures, record keeping, financial status, construction and labor standards (if applicable), and beneficiary data.

The Town of Christiansburg will monitor its own performance in meeting the goals of the Consolidated Plan by conducting frequent reviews with members of council, council appointed street committee, and citizens. By gathering beneficiary information we are able to measure our success. Changes in policies and economic trends may affect a project's ability to meet proposed goals.

Throughout the year we will continue to work with citizens and committees to address various community needs and goals. With town participation in the Consolidated Plan process, we developed goals based on current needs. Funding dollars are then directed to activities that assist in meeting those goals and needs.

To ensure that the Town of Christiansburg complies with HUD's yearly "timeliness" test, the Town of Christiansburg will take shovel ready projects into account when awarding funds to applicants. Certain projects will not always have the capacity to immediately spend their allocations; so all projects that receive funds are given 18 months to spend their funds starting October 1<sup>st</sup> of the program year. In the 13<sup>th</sup> month, projects will be notified, in writing, of their timeliness of expenditure status and are reminded that if funds are not expended by the end of the 18-month time frame, the town will withdraw funds and reallocate them to a project that meets CDBG requirements and has an immediate need. In addition, all public service activities are provided a 12-month timeframe in which to use CDBG funds towards eligible public service activities. This ties the beneficiaries to a one year reporting period and allows the Town a more efficient process for the administration of these activities.
